## THE MUSIC CORNER



At coffee hour this past summer, a member of the congregation said to me: “Hal, never forget that what you have here is a music ministry, and this is what it does for me.” She continued to tell me how the music at GUCC has such a positive impact on her spiritual life and that it reminded her of what was most important, especially during challenging times.

At Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ, where I studied church music, the founder, John Findlay Williamson, coined the phrase “Minister of Music” and charged us to go out and be musical leaders in our communities. It is with that mission in mind that we continue to “*Serve God Through Music*” during the month of October.

**Oct. 1** — For this World Communion Sunday we bring you *With this Communion, We Thank You* by well-known sacred composer Jay Althouse (1951-) who has over 700 sacred works in publication. This anthem accentuates the presence of Christ and reminds us that the bread and wine are a gift from Him. With a gentle, flowing melody and lovely arpeggios coming from the piano, this music creates a sense of peace and calm around this sacred time.

**Oct. 8** — American composer Jean Pasquet (1896-1977) created this week’s offering *A Hymn of Praise* based on the liturgy of St. James. There are soaring vocal lines on the text of greatness and an exciting fugue for all four vocal parts. The text is quite powerful: “Almighty God, whose glory the heavens are telling”... in partnership with very dramatic music written in the romantic style.

**Oct. 15** — Lorenz Corporation is a prolific provider of sacred music for over 80 years. Roger Wilson was a composer and editor at Lorenz his entire career following in his father Ira Wilson’s footsteps. *Who Is on the Lord’s Side?* was composed by Roger in the 1950’s.

Based on the tune *Armageddon* by Luise Reichardt and John Goss, this bold, march-like anthem includes very direct text: “Who is on the Lord’s side, who will serve God?”

**Oct. 22** — Almost everyone is familiar with the tune *All Through the Night*. It originated in Wales in 1784 in Edward Jones *Musical and Poetical Relics of the Welsh Bards* and is now heard in music, film, television and video games. The Welsh title is *Ar Hyd y Nos* and is often sung as *go my children with blessing*. Our version

this Sunday. *Come, Follow Me!* is gentle, unhurried, and has lovely duets between the sopranos and altos and again with the tenors and basses.

**Oct. 29** *God Has Work for Us to Do* is a modern piece (2012) by Mark Miller. Dr. Miller, a life-long Methodist, is professor of church music at Drew University and lecturer in the practice of sacred music at Yale. He believes passionately that music can change the world and that the music he composes, performs, teaches and leads will inspire and empower people to create beloved community. With text by Carl P. Daw, this anthem that we offer today has the very relevant message of “till all jails are empty, all the bellies filled, till no one hurts or steals, God has work for us to do.” It is written with the performance guidelines “with energy and hope” with simple melodies and lilting accompaniment.

Our early music consort will offer a composition by Johann Christoph Petz (1664-1716), Suite 1 for 2 Treble Recorders and Basso continuo. Musicians are Gina and Sonia on recorders, Tom on gamba and Bronwyn on the harpsichord.

### STEWARDSHIP: DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that you can donate appreciated stock you’ve held for more than one year to the church? It can be used to fulfill your pledge. If the stock has lost value, it may be better to sell the stock and donate the cash proceeds. If you are over 70 1/2 you might be able to utilize all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD) from a retirement account as a donation.
