From the pastor's desk ...

Dear Friends,

Autumn, for me, has always been associated with going back to school. My first school was in a rural community in Canada, and I remember walking to school beneath the old maples that lined the road, enjoying the sound and the spicy scent as I kicked up the fallen leaves that blanketed the sidewalk. I have photographs of my sons standing at the bus stop in their yet to be ripped or stained back-to-school clothes, excited about seeing old friends and beginning new projects. I remember my years of working in the public schools, and the bright smiles of the children returning full of stories of their summers and ready for a new school year.

In last month's "Gleanings," Moderator Jeff Pierpont wrote of the great changes that have happened, in our society, within the decades since my early school years, in the fifties, and even since my children's elementary school years, in the eighties. Jeff noted that the church's sense of "mission" has had to broaden from something we do far away, usually in a foreign country, to becoming more aware of, and seeking to address, needs in our own immediate communities. I wrote of the outreach the church provides through the Discretionary Fund, and I thank those who have made recent contributions to that fund. Now I would like to tell you of another local need and opportunity.

In conversations with the Lakeview School Principal, Eric Erwin, and Guidance Teacher, Sally Cochran, I have learned that children at the school are dealing with many challenges in their young lives. More than two thirds of the students qualify for free or reduced cost school meals, and some families are chronically food insecure. Parents don't tend to engage in their children's school programs or to support their children staying after school for enrichment activities. And the opiate epidemic is having an impact in Greensboro, too. I shared what I have learned with the Church Council, and they have given enthusiastic support to the idea of reaching out to the school to address some of the needs of Greensboro's children.

Principal Erwin told me that the school needs mentors for individual students and grownups who could come in and play chess, teach knitting, cook with students, act as "reading buddies" (listening to children read), and read to children. He would like to have "an army of grandparents" involved in the school. He also sees this as a two-way conversation, where anyone with a particular skill or focus could offer their expertise. There are also material needs, and I have given the school a donation from the Discretionary Fund to provide for immediate needs, such as a pair of winter boots. In addition, the school needs socks and underwear, and food items for the backpack program that sends home food for the weekend for children whose families struggle to feed them.

THE MUSIC CORNER

With the beauty of fall around us, we continue to *"Serve God Through Music"* and provide some beautiful anthems during October:

 2^{nd} : For this communion Sunday, the American sacred music duo of Don Besig and Nancy Price composed *The Upper Room* which is our musical offering for this service. It is a contemporary piece (1988), incorporates a soloist, and the text focuses on the dialogue of the Last Supper: "Master stood among the twelve He called his closest friends.....soon I must leave you...."

9th: Arthur Schlosberg was born in Germany and fled to Paris during the 1933 Nazi occupation and took the French name Jean Berger (1909-2002). He is well known for his compositions for choral ensemble and solo voice, and was a professor at Middlebury College. Today we offer his anthem *I to the Hills Lift Up Mine Eyes*, sung at a gentle pace with text inspired from the Bay Psalm Book (1640) including Psalm 121.

16th: Out of cold, dark, oppressive Russia during 1884-5, Tchaikovsky composed some of the most mystical, sublime melodies ever written. During this romantic period of music, he composed nine sacred songs, one of which is entitled *Hymn to the Cherubim*. The arrangement of this song we present today is by Allan Dash that includes terraced dynamics and climaxes toward the end of the piece with a joyful Allelujah!

23rd: *Make Us Instruments of Your Peace* will sound very familiar to you as you will hear parts of *Dona Nobis Pacem*. What makes this anthem so unusual and interesting is that the "Dona" is juxtaposed with impressionist French composer Erik Satie's *Gymnopedie No 1*. for piano (1888). Binding it all together is text from *Prayer of St. Francis* by Francis of Assisi, 13th century.

30th: Austrian born composer Anton Bruckner(1824 -96) is well known for his symphonies, masses and motets. His sacred piece *Locus Iste (By Our Lord God)* was inspired by the *Liber Usalis*, a collection of Gregorian chants in the Catholic tradition from the 11th century. This motet will be sung in Latin and English in an Allegro Moderato tempo with a wide range of dynamics.
