#### The Music Corner

Our sacred musical offerings in August continue our mission of "Serving God Through Music:"

August 7<sup>th</sup>: For this communion Sunday we offer *Bread of the World (Ave Verum)* by Guilmant. It is warm, lush and written in the romantic style, with an "Andante Religioso" tempo marking.

August 14<sup>th</sup>: *Jesu, Joyaunce Of My Heart*" by A.R. Ahle and harmonized by Bach, is a duet between a soloist and the choir. Throughout the anthem the soloist sings a statement and the choir answers in a lovely antiphonal style that balances the music in a perfect blend of voices.

**August 21<sup>st</sup>**: We bring back to you one of our summer favorites; *Family of Christ*. This anthem features flute, piano and choir in a lyrical and light setting. Imbedded in the middle of the piece is the hymn *The Church's One Foundation*, which is sung in a chorale style leading to a strong ending with the flute, choir and piano in full volume.

August 28<sup>th</sup>: Our Consort will offer a prelude by Benedetto Marcello (1686-1739), *Sonata in E minor, Opus II, Nr.4.* J. S Bach wrote a cantata for every Sunday of the year. We have chosen to sing *Laud We the Name* (*Ich will den Namen*) from Cantata #142, *Uns ist ein Kind Geboren*. A very uplifting piece in C Major, it is challenging with runs, a fugue, and is to be performed at a fairly brisk pace. We will sing it twice, once in English and then again in German as we leave the month of August.
