#### FROM THE TRUSTEES

Our priority for 2018 is to focus on church properties. The Trustees have appointed a dedicated properties committee comprised of Andy Dales (trustee representative), Mike Coffey, and Ken Johnston. This team works collaboratively to repair, maintain, and improve our building and grounds.

Many projects require additional volunteers who are brought on board as needed. Judy Dunnan and Dan Predpall have agreed to be an on-going part of the larger team and their expertise is greatly appreciated. The committee is currently working on the emergency lighting system, the emergency exit routes and signs, and on optimizing the operation of the wheelchair lift. The committee also plans to review the purpose and functionality of the exit ramp on the north side of the building. This exit is currently not functional due to the level of the ramp being too high and also due to snow pile up during winter months. The committee will make a recommendation following their review. If you have any inputs regarding church properties, please contact me or one of the members of the committee.

We continue to receive 2018 pledges. We need these pledges in order to know what income to expect throughout the year. This enables the Trustees to better manage the church's resources. Please pledge if you have not yet done so. And if you have already sent in your pledge, Thank You!

#### THE MUSIC CORNER

Happy New Year from the choir loft, piano, organ, harpsichord and all things music.

As I look at the liturgical calendar, Epiphany is here with some very special opportunities for our sacred music offerings during this cold moth of January:

7th—Multi-faceted Irish (Belfast) composer, arranger and performer Richard Blake, the son of highly accomplished musical parents, currently resides and works in London. For this communion Sunday we offer one of his early compositions, *Bread of Life*, a peaceful, light anthem that features a soloist and the text "O break the bread of life, Dear Lord to me, As you did break the loaves beside the sea…."

**14th**— *Once More, My Soul* is based on an American Folk Hymn adapted and arranged by Robert Roesch. Beginning with strong unison voices, this anthem then moves into a quieter chorale using block harmony (hymn style) and introducing the text: "Once more, my soul, the rising day Salutes thy waking eyes; Once more, my voice, thy tribute pay to God that rules the skies", and concludes with a long, suspenseful "amen."

**21st**— Many have told me they love the music of Mozart, so today we offer *Now Sing Before the Lord*, with music by Mozart and adapted and arranged by Douglas Wagner. Written in the neo-classical style, the Soprano and alto voices proclaim: "Mountains, hills, all living creatures now sing praise, and sing your best before the Lord". Centering this anthem is a lively four-part fugue sung in true Mozartian fashion with the main theme taking us to a strong conclusion driving to the cadence.

**28th**— "Silently now I wait for Thee, ready, my God, Thy will to see; Open my eyes, illumine me, Holy Spirit!" is part of the text for this quiet, low, contemplative anthem entitled *Open My Eyes, Let Me See*, by modern sacred composer Hugh Livingston and arranged by Larry Pugh. With several key changes and lush triplet rhythms, the piano accompaniment uses harp-like phrasing and enhances the prayer-like style of this lovely anthem. Our Early Music Group consisting of Gina, Tom, Sonia and Hal will provide a Prelude and Postlude from the Baroque era, *Sonate 1*, by Arcangelo Corelli (1653-1713), with harpsichord and recorders on this Harpsichord Sunday.

Please offer any comments, questions or suggestions you may have as we begin this new year and continue our mission to *Serve God Through Music* in 2018.
