**Our Church's Wider Mission:** As we support Our Church's Wider Mission, we lift up the work of the Lesotho Evangelical Church in Southern Africa (LECSA) advocates for conservation agriculture or "Farming God's Way," which practices minimum tillage, use of mulch, covering crops, and mixed cropping. Lesotho has been hit hard by climate change. The country is experiencing extreme weather conditions (heavy rains, hailstorms, and excessive drought). These weather patterns have seriously affected the production of crops and vegetables, and the country is in a food crisis. LECSA trained thirteen (13) Pastors from nine (9) presbyteries to train others in conservation agriculture. Those who practice it widely benefit because the yield from their fields is increasing despite the extreme weather. The church is encouraging other parishes and rural communities to join in and fight against the food crisis.
