Our Church's Wider Mission: As we support Our Church's Wider Mission, we lift up the National Council of Churches in Korea (NCCK) who prioritizes the process of discernment and collective action to promote unity and healing among its members. Promoting human rights has been a guideline for cooperative discipleship among the churches. In 1974, when the dictatorship's suppression of human rights reached its peak, the NCCK established the "Human Rights Committee" (now the NCCK Human Rights Center) and declared its commitment to pray and act together with marginalized people to defend human rights and establish justice in Korean society. For the 50th anniversary of the NCCK Human Rights Center, it is joining with other ecumenical groups to host a "Congress for Asian Human Rights Defenders".
